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02 Chairman's Update

Spring is in the air and we are cautiously optimistic after a challenging few months for India and the Foundation with the impact of the 2nd COVID wave now behind us.

The Foundation's fight against the COVID spread across the 24 villages in the rural community is building traction with the number of COVID positive infection dropping from 50% of all patients tested. Our Mobile Clinic was relaunched in early September.

Our free online Nursery & Primary School classes have been delivered through borrowed mobile phones for children in the remote villages who have missed out on schooling during COVID lockdown.

Demand for our tailoring classes is high at the Women Centre, supporting our drive to empower women in the community.

Children are starting to come back to our Children's Home from their guardians/parents post the lockdown and schools for Year 9 to 12 students reopened on September 1st.

We will start our renovation work of the two old dormitories in September to assist our transformation to a boarding home for deserving children thanks to a generous donor in the USA.

Discussions are in progress for a partnership arrangement with the Foundation and Joss Brooks - Auroville by way of consulting services. The Auroville team will also further develop and renovate our Environmental Education Centre.

The Fund offers those young people opportunities they would not otherwise have. It enables them to develop the strength to continue studying and to believe in themselves. This will give them independence, personal responsibility and control over their future.

Next year eight more students will be completing year 12. They will be able to access our Fund and receive the benefits it provides including, most importantly, self empowerment through learning.

Endowment Fund Launched

With the help of a generous seeding donation from a family in the USA, The East West Foundation has started an Endowment Fund to ensure long-term sustainability of the Foundation.

The Management Committee/Board developed a comprehensive policy and procedure to ensure strong governance process including investment, use and withdrawal policy of the fund and monitoring/reporting process. The Endowment Fund's capital will be invested in low-risk assets and the interest income will be made available to the Foundation medium/long term. Short term all interest income will be reinvested to grow the Endowment Fund.

Your support of the Endowment Fund will ensure the Foundation's critical work to the rural community continues long-term (for the next 25 years atleast!) Donations to the endowment fund are also tax deductible.

07 Health Care Services & COVID Update

We are continuing our critical work including COVID education prevention measures program, COVID testing, prevention medication and use of oxygen concentrators at a time when Indian public hospitals are overwhelmed. Our comprehensive COVID education program across the 24 villages is very popular with 150 to 200 participants attending each session. We are continuing to encourage the community to get vaccinated and exercise COVID safe preventive measures.

Thanks to all for your support. The Foundation's fight against the COVID spread is building traction with the number of COVID positive infections dropping from 50% of all patients tested at our clinic in April 2021 to 10% in August 2021.

Our Health Care Centre at the Foundation provides 60-100 patient consultations/day or 36,000 consultations/year. Our Mobile Clinic visits each of the 24 villages monthly.

Our primary health care services costs \$100,000 per annum.

The Foundation employs a doctor, four nurses and two social workers and support staff.





Online Nursery & Primary School

Our Nursery & Primary School teachers (Mrs. Amudha, Mrs. Jothilakshmi & Ms. Poorani) have been conducting online classes to young children across the 24 villages, delivering lessons 6 days a week on English, Tamil, Basic Maths, Science & Technology, Environment and Arts since September 2020. All schools including Nursery & Primary Schools were closed due to COVID lockdown in March 2020.

Our free online Nursery & Primary School children's classes are delivered through mobile phones to the 24 remote villages. Children have access to a mobile phone from their parents. The online education program is reaching children in remote villages including tribal kids.

Theses online classes are very popular with the young children that have missed out on schooling due to the COVID lockdown. Children look forward to the online classes with much enthusiasm.
